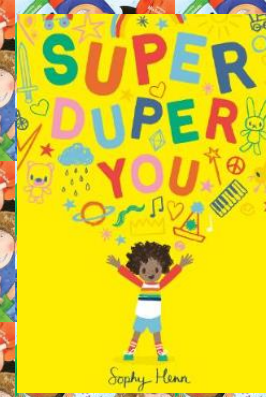


Foundation Stage Term 1

Marvellous Me!



Communication and Language

Talk about experiences that are familiar to them, family routines and special occasions. Develop listening skills and be able to follow simple instructions.

Understanding the World

Past and Present: Understand order from baby to adult– basic chronology/ timeline. Talk about members of their family and community– share photos and discuss. Understand recent past through stories and photos. The Natural World: Learn how humans grow and change. Name common body parts. Seasonal Changes: exploring Autumn

Physical Development

Fine motor skills: Encourage tripod pencil grasp and correct posture when seated. Gross motor skills: PE Move around safely in a space and stop safely. Develop control when using equipment. Play safely as a group. Take turns. Work co-operatively with a partner.

Maths

Access continuous provision. Match and sort objects, shapes and amounts. Compare amounts- more, fewer or same? Compare size, mass and capacity. Exploring pattern.

Playing and exploring: Children investigate and experience things and 'have a go'.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Being Me in My World

Understand how it feels to belong. Begin to understand each other's similarities and differences. Start to recognise and manage feelings.

Literacy

Handle books correctly and follow print left to right, top to bottom. Learn to blend words orally– Fred talk games. RWI: Learn to read all single letter Set 1 sounds and practise writing them daily.



RE: Theme: Myself

Key Question: What makes people special?

Expressive Arts and Design

Use a range of mark making implements– pencils, crayons, felt-tips, pens, paint dabbers, chalk, etc. Draw a self-portrait (black pen): draw definite features. Playdough– use rolling pins and cutters. Clay– make a simple hedgehog using tools.

Charanga Music – Me!

Listen and respond to different styles of music. Learn to sing or sing along with nursery rhymes and action songs.
