Foundation Stage Term 3 Once upon a time...

Expressive Arts and Design Small world scenarios (e.g. 3 Billy Goats Gruff), puppets and masks to retell stories. 'Once upon a time' role-play area to create/retell stories. Collage 3 Little Pigs houses using different materials. Use construction equipment to create bridges.

Music: Everyone! Listen and respond to different styles of music. Learn to sing along with nursery rhymes and action songs. Improvise playing instruments. Share and perform them. Physical Development Fine motor skills: Children to draw freely and use correct letter formation. Use scissors with increasing control. Gross motor skills: PE Gymnastics. Create short sequences using shapes, balances and travelling actions. Travel around, over and through apparatus.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development Dreams and Goals Understand that if you persevere you can tackle challenges. Learn to use kind words to encourage others. Understand what it means to feel proud when you have achieved your goal. Communication and Language Remember key points from a story. Retell and invent stories. Ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them. Describe events. Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.
